#### The Role

As Programme Coordinator, you will oversee the smooth running of this ambitious 18-month action learning programme. Working closely with participating museums, digital consultants and cultural partners, you will ensure the project is delivered effectively, on time and within budget.

This is a freelance contract averaging one day per week, with some busier and quieter periods. You'll be the central contact point for partners and participants, coordinating training, digital audits, content development and evaluation.

- Facilitate collaboration and knowledge sharing across the museum network.
